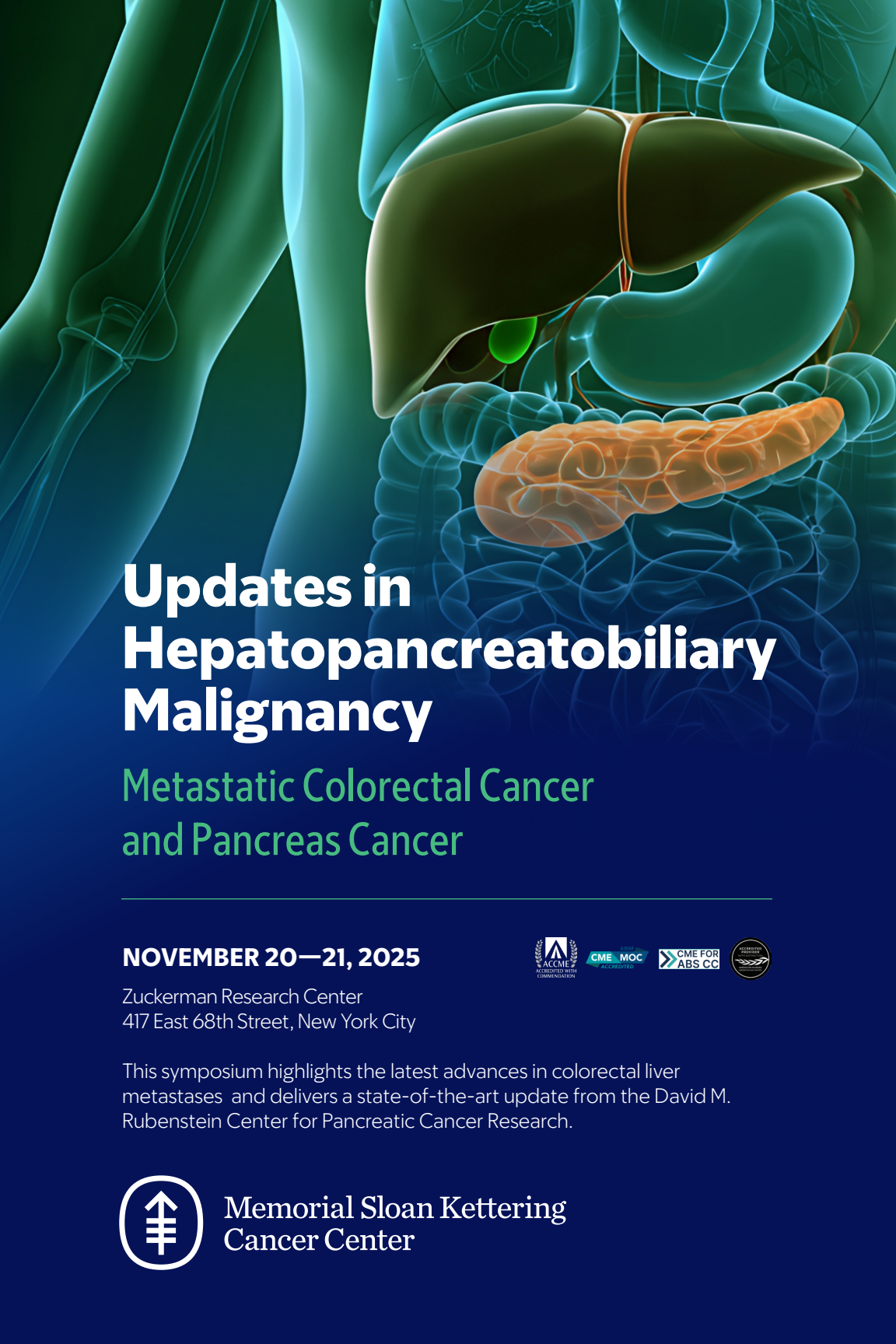

These scientific advances have transformed the management of patients with metastatic colorectal cancer and pancreas cancer, leading to improvements in survival and quality of life.

We're honored to welcome **Prof. Dr. Bas Groot Koerkamp**, an internationally recognized Surgical Oncologist at the Erasmus MC Cancer Institute in Rotterdam, as our keynote speaker.



Since 2014, Dr. Groot Koerkamp has served in the Department of HPB and Transplant Surgery at Erasmus MC, where he manages patients with liver, pancreas, and biliary tract tumors and performs kidney and liver transplants. He also leads several clinical trials, including PREOPANC-2 and the PUMP studies.

## Networking Reception

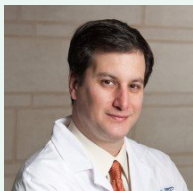
A networking reception will follow Thursday's program, providing an opportunity for faculty and participants to connect, exchange ideas, and foster new collaborations.

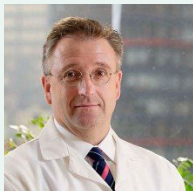

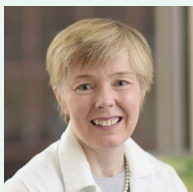
