CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

We invite researchers, clinicians, trainees, and healthcare professionals to submit abstracts for poster presentation at the **7th MSK Cardio-Oncology Symposium**. This is an opportunity to share novel science, innovative research, and unique case presentations related to cardiovascular health in cancer patients and survivors.

Previously presented work is welcome and will be considered; however, full manuscripts must not have been published in journals or online publications. All submissions will undergo blinded review.

Accepted abstracts will be presented as **in-person paper posters during the networking reception**, and submission indicates that one presenting author agrees to attend and present in person at the symposium. The presenting author will be offered **complimentary registration**, contingent upon CME compliance.


