Overview

This is a one-and-a-half-day live and virtual rectal cancer symposium will feature **international and national expert faculty**.

Day 1 includes presentations that will delve into the complexities of choosing between neoadjuvant therapies and operative and non-operative approaches. The day will begin with the **Stuart Guan lecture** on the use of immunotherapy in CRC. This talk will be followed by sessions on

- 1) early-stage rectal cancer;
- 2) upper rectal cancer;
- 3) mid/lower rectal cancer; and
- 4) MSI and stage IV rectal cancer.

Each session will be accompanied by **interactive discussions** with thought leaders and attendees. Additionally, in-person attendees are invited to join the course faculty for a **networking reception** on Friday evening, immediately following the conclusion of the day.

Day 2 will include sessions with presentations highlighting **recent landmark colorectal cancer clinical trials** and real-life applications, including Niche, Dynamic, AINKER, and NeoTrial, by their investigators and discussed by expert faculty. The day will conclude with a **multidisciplinary tumor board**.

This symposium is intended for medical oncologists, radiation oncologists, interventional radiologists, colorectal/ hepatopancreatobiliary/oncologic surgeons, gastroenterologists, pathologists, and other oncology care team members interested in rectal cancer. 
Call for Abstracts
