





Overview

This one-day conference will be an opportunity for researchers and all healthcare providers, including faculty, advanced practice providers, nurses, social workers, case managers, trainees, and students as well as support staff to learn about ways to address the social drivers of health and improve cancer care.

The program will consist of lectures and panel discussions with leaders in the field. The lectures will provide institutional context for health equity work, share the quality of care outcomes and metrics, and describe interventions and policies that can be used to optimize health equity. Speakers will cover topics ranging from healthcare access to patient navigation, and enrollment in clinical trials.
