Overview

The 13th Annual Board Review and Comprehensive Update in Hematology and Medical Oncology, condensed into an intensive three-and-a-half-day virtual program, provides a thorough and up-to-date review of the diagnosis, staging, and management of neoplastic diseases, encompassing both solid tumors and hematologic malignancies.

Lectures and discussions focus on disease-specific topics in gastrointestinal, gynecologic, thoracic, head and neck, genitourinary, soft tissue and skin, and central nervous system oncology, as well as hematologic oncology.

This course is a live virtual event designed for medical oncology professionals, including physicians, nurses, pharmacists, fellows, and residents. It aims to help participants effectively prepare for the **American Board of Internal Medicine** certification and recertification examinations in hematology and medical oncology.

At the conclusion of the program, attendees will be able to:

- Define state-of-the-science in diagnosis, staging, and therapeutic management of solid tumor cancers and hematologic cancers.
- Discuss recent treatment advances in solid tumor and hematologic oncology and apply knowledge gained in modern clinical practice
- Prepare for ABIM examinations in medical oncology and hematology.

Participants will also receive access to an online syllabus featuring select PDFs of presentation slides and video recordings of the lectures.
