

This symposium will provide healthcare professionals with new or enhanced knowledge that can be implemented in the evaluation and management of cancer and treatment-related impairments. Emphasis will be placed on how to address the rehabilitative needs of patients with adult and pediatric cancers.

This two-day symposium includes Friday afternoon plenary sessions followed by break-out sessions on Saturday that attendees may select during registration. Included in this program will be special "Meet the Experts" panels with both physicians and therapists to discuss program development with time for Q&A.
