

RECTAL MRI WORKSHOP

The use of pelvic MRI in routine clinical practice is growing rapidly, mainly due to the extensive literature supporting its clinical value and expanding clinical indications. This hands-on course will offer the opportunity to learn or brush up on rectal MRI skills. Short lectures and whole case reviews on individual workstations will demonstrate the pearls and pitfalls in the evaluation of rectal MRI performed for staging and follow-up evaluations. (One workstation per participant.)

This educational activity is designed for practicing radiologists and radiologists in training as well as anyone with an interest in pelvic MRI.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- Become familiar with rectal MRI indications, acquisition protocols and the normal appearance of male and female pelvic structures as visualized by MRI
- Identify abnormal findings on rectal MRI scans and understand the relevance of these findings to patient care
- Recognize the imaging characteristics of treated rectal cancers and the evolution of findings during nonoperative surveillance MRI exams
- Appreciate the value of structured reporting and a standardized lexicon in pelvic MRI




