OVERVIEW

More and more, cancer survivors are being cared for by non-oncology providers. Understanding potential toxicities related to chemotherapy, radiation, immunotherapy and hormone therapy is essential in providing comprehensive care for all stages of survivorship. During this one-day live virtual symposium on caring for cancer survivors in the primary care setting, attendees will hear speakers from **cardiology, endocrinology, integrative medicine, behavioral health, nursing, and medicine.**

The symposium will address the entire spectrum of cancer survivorship care: monitoring and management of late- and long-term effects ranging from cardiotoxicity to infertility, surveillance for recurrence, screening for other malignancies, and promotion of healthy lifestyles.
