

October 17 and 18, 2019

Course Overview

The aim of the two-day program, presented by faculty from Memorial Sloan Kettering and invited speakers, is to highlight new developments in immune checkpoint blockade and discuss pressing clinical issues for best practices, including side effect management. We will provide useful insights into ongoing cancer research in the field, and at MSK.

Target Audience

The intended audience includes members of the Memorial Hospital Alumni Society (physicians who have trained at MSK for six months or more, and staff members who have been at MSK for six months or more), current MSK staff, and physicians trained elsewhere who wish to attend. As the meeting will be a clinically focused discussion, nursing staff and other care team members are also encouraged to attend.

Educational Objectives

The course objective is to advance and disseminate knowledge of new approaches to the multidisciplinary management of people receiving immunotherapy with immune checkpoint blockade. MSK and community physicians look forward to a great dialogue on the best ways to treat our patients.

Course Design

This course is comprised of lectures, debates on hot topics, and case discussions, encouraging the exchange of ideas between faculty and participants.
